Overview by Chair

The Annual Report provides me with an opportunity to review the last 12 months.

The year began with the local elections in May. Fifteen councillors were elected to represent Lanchester on the Parish Council. Names and contact details of the selected councillors can be found overleaf.

Work continues on forging links with the Unitary Authority which is due to come into operation in April 2009.

Within the Village, the Christmas lights were once again a great success. In addition the Village Map information point was installed and a new bus shelter erected.

The Parish Council continued to establish and develop valuable partnership working to ensure services are provided effectively.

Lanchester Parish Council are looking forward to exciting developments in 2008 / 09.

The emergence of the new Unitary Authority in 2009 will mean that the coming year will provide opportunities for partnership working and sharing of good practise and information.

The Parish Council has made a commitment to work towards Quality Status which would result in increased communication with residents, best value provision of services and opportunities to engage in further provision of services.

The Parish Council are working with local groups to finalise details of a new play area at Kitswell Road and have already identified monies through balances to part fund the scheme.

Services and Activities

Council services in Lanchester are currently offered through three tiers of local government:

- Lanchester Parish Council
- Derwentside District Council
- Durham County Council

With the emergence of the new Unitary Authority in April 2009, only two tiers of local government will remain, these being the new Unitary authority and Lanchester Parish Council.

Lanchester Parish Council provides services that enhance life in the parish from play areas to Christmas lights and leading the debate on our area's future. The areas of Lanchester, Hurbuck Cottages, Hollinside, Malton and Ornsby Hill are covered.

Lanchester Parish Council currently provides and maintains the following services within the village:

- Play Areas
- Allotments
- Village Green
- Xmas Lights
- Hanging Baskets
- Bus shelters
- Public seating (some)
- General upkeep of the village

Derwentside District Council consults Lanchester Parish Council on all planning matters affecting Lanchester Parish. The Parish Council continues to fulfil its objectives in protecting and enhancing the village by its consideration of planning applications and comments to Derwentside District Council which reflect the content of the Village Design Statement.

Lanchester Parish Council continues to work alongside various partners such as; Derwentside District Council, Durham County Council, Lanchester Partnership, Police and Community Groups etc.
