Lanchester Parish Council Annual Report 2010 / 11



Welcome to Lanchester Parish Council's Annual Report. This report outlines the main achievements and services offered by Lanchester Parish Council during 2010 / 11

Overview by Chair

The Annual Report provides me with an opportunity to review the last 12 months. This year has been another busy year with work undertaken on several major projects.

The year began well with the news that Kitswell Park Bike Track and Play Area had won the community Partnership Award at the County Durham Annual Environment Awards. The judges were impressed with the community partnership working which made the project a reality. The awards ceremony took place at the Gala Theatre on 24 May. In February further works took place at the Bike Track and Play Area greatly improving the entrance area.

In May the official launch of the Locality Map Document took place on the Village green. The document which provides a framework of actions to safeguard farming, wildlife and the environment in the Parish recognised the need to value the rural community and was produced by representatives from the Parish Council, Partnership, farming, wildlife and environment groups. A funding package of £73,000 was finalised in the summer to employ a Development Officer to carry out the



actions. A Development Officer was appointed and commenced work in November for an 18 month period. Funding was made available from Rural Development Programme for England, the Heritage Lottery Fund and Lanchester Parish Council.

Following consultation with the community on improvements to the village green, work commenced in December on phase one which includes; the installation of a path along the beck, seating, tree works, a new Parish notice board and surface improvements. The project was made possible through a grant from County Durham Environment Trust, funding from Lanchester Dairies and the Parish Council.

The summer saw the start of the Gateway project which aims to introduce physical features at the entrances to the village to slow the speed of traffic. Funded through the Area Action Partnership, a working group comprising of Parish Councillors, County Councillors, Partnership, Area Action Partnership Co-ordinator, Police, Durham County Council Highways Officers and school representatives drew up suggestions and consulted with the community in November. Work on the approved features will commence in May 2011.

The second edition of the DIAL (Directory of Information About Lanchester) was printed in October 2010. The document produced by the Parish Council and Partnership offers a guide to public services, local societies, clubs and organisations in the Parish and was distributed to households in December. Copies

are still available from the Parish Council office (01207 521957).



This year saw the resignation of two valued Parish Councillors. Following her election as MP in May, Pat Glass found it difficult to continue as a Parish Councillor and Neil Fleming, moved out of the Parish. The vacancies led to a By-election in February which resulted in Malcolm Clarke (The Labour Party) and Alan Myers (The Labour Party) being duly elected following a turnout of 28%.

The Council has continued to produce the Annual Report and the quarterly Council Newsletter both of which have been distributed widely throughout the community. Within the Village, the Christmas lights and summer hanging baskets once again showed off the Parish to its best.
